1. Call to Order

2. Board Chair Comments

There were no comments from the Chair

3. Presentation: History of Thomas Nelson and Others who Buildings are Named After

Ms. Callaway introduced Professor Stacey Schneider who along with Dr. Lauren Williams researched our facility and college namesakes. Professor Schneider developed an outstanding presentation that the College and Facilities Name Committee, and the President's Expanded Cabinet have all received. There are four board members on the committee, and they all recommended and agreed that this presentation should be delivered in its totality to the College Board.

Professor Schneider provided a summary of her background and stated that she realizes that this might be the most important thing she does in her Thomas Nelson career.

Ms. Schneider's research focuses on the buildings named during the 60s and 70s and is judgement free so people can make their own well-informed decisions.

- Ms. Schneider suggested approaching this task with a spirit that change is okay and provided a few examples of good changes. Libraries removed card catalogues, in 1968 TNCC students weren't gators, they were "swamp stompers", the circle of flags used to represent the 13 original colonies, and in 1982 a \$14,000 computer was not as fast as most smart phones. Institutional change can be good.
- In 1966 two names were in early contention for the new institution George Wythe Community College & Peninsula Community College. By 1968 the name Thomas Nelson was selected by the College Board.

- ✤ At that time, the College Board was hoping to celebrate Thomas Nelson because he was the following:
 - Leading Businessman in Yorktown
 - Member of The House of Burgesses
 - Early Patriot Participated in Virginia's Tea Party
 - Used His Own Money and Raised Funds for The Revolutionary Cause
 - Signer of The Declaration of Independence
 - General of Virginia Militia
 - Possibly Lent Virginia Funds to Prosecute War (never recovered)
 - Served as Wartime Governor of Virginia
- When looking through a 1960s lens he looks good. Ms. Schneider showed a promotion / commercial for Thomas Nelson Community College from 1992 and how we embraced the Thomas Nelson legacy.
- ✤ In 1974 the College Board agreed that all campus buildings would be named after "close contemporaries" of Thomas Nelson. (TNCC College Board Minutes, 8/22/74 pg. 2) The College President, Dr. G.O. Cannon was asked to bring four possible names for buildings.
- Ms. Schneider reviewed the namesakes of Thomas Nelson Community College, Wythe Hall, Harrison Hall, Griffin Hall, Moore Hall, and Diggs Hall.

Professor Schneider asked if there were any questions and offered to answer questions if board members had questions later. She volunteered to make her research available to anyone who wanted to see it.

Ms. Callaway explained the next steps will be sharing this information with a broader group including the community. The College and Facilities Name Committee has a sub-committee chaired by Ms. Clifton. This Outreach Sub-Committee has identified several community leaders to present this presentation. A survey is being created to be sent to all the various internal and external stakeholders. The historical data will be posted on our website so it will be available for everyone looking to respond to the survey and for their own interest to be able to hear and see Professor Schneider's presentation. Survey results along with recommendations will then be brought to the College Board.
